

Project SN-AFU® – Print Directions

Cards

These directions apply to all cards. You will need a pdf file reader to print the cards.

- Core Board Game cards print on 39 sheets of letter-size paper. The card game and expansion sets require fewer pages.
- Set the pdf file to Landscape. This is done in Print Options, Orientation.
- Print single-sided. To keep your cost and effort to a minimum, free-download cards only have a black and white face image.
- You can print all cards on white paper. However, for better results, consider printing Plan, Do and Stuff Happens cards on pastel shaded paper (Plan cards on blue; Do cards on green; Stuff Happens cards on salmon) so the decks are easily identified.
- Cut the cards to size. Use a paper cutter for best results, but a scissors will do. Consider sharing the cutting with your friends as part of playing the first game.

Card stock is better than paper. Use 110 lb cardstock for best results.

Card Game – Card Piles Sheet

Print the Card Piles Sheet file and cut out the Card Piles sheet. Use the heaviest weight paper you have. Print in black & white or color.

Game Board

When printing the Game Board file, set the pdf reader to Landscape. Print it yourself, or take the file to a print shop.

- 1. Print at home on paper**
 - a. Print on white letter-size paper, in color if you can but black & white works fine.
 - b. Use the heaviest weight of paper you have.
- 2. Go to a print shop**
 - a. Print in color.
 - b. Have them use 110 lb white cardstock.

Game Pieces

If you have game pieces from another game, use those. If not, print the Game Pieces file. Set the pdf file to Portrait. Print it yourself, or take the file to a print shop.

- 1. Print at home on paper**
 - a. Print in color. Use a heavy weight of white paper.
 - b. Use a scissors to cut out the game pieces.
- 2. Go to a print shop**
 - a. Print in color on 110 lb white cardstock.
 - b. Use a scissors to cut out the game pieces.
